
Local Attractions

- The Thargomindah Hydro Power Plant and Bore played a significant role in the history of Australia's hydro-electricity. Hydro Power Plant demonstrations are conducted daily at 4.30pm during March to October.
- Leahy House in Dowling Street was built in 1885 of locally made mud brick and was originally the home of the Hon John Leahy MP. Sir Sidney Kidman also owned the house at one time.
- The historic Thargomindah Hospital building, built prior to 1888, has had a long history of service. After it was decommissioned, it was converted into flats, then became a home, a Visitor Information Centre, and is now a Museum, which is open daily at for Tours from March to October.
- Thargomindah has several walking tracks including the Heritage Walk and Nature Walk. The Bulloo River Walk is the most popular walk with a concrete shared path leading from the Explorers Caravan Park to Pelican Point on the river.
- Lake Bindegolly National Park is a great place for bird watching and has a walking trail around the Lake. It is located approximately 40kms east of Thargomindah.
- Currawinya National Park is located just a few kilometres from Hungerford. The Park features a salt and a freshwater lake, more than 200 species of birds and a variety of wildlife.
- The historic Royal Mail Hotel is located at Hungerford, 164kms south of Thargomindah. It was constructed in 1873 of corrugated iron, and was once a Cobb & Co Staging Post.
- The Noccundra Hotel was first settled in 1882, and is built of sandstone. It is located 142kms west of Thargomindah, across the Grey Range, on the banks of the Wilson River.
- The Burke and Wills "Dig Tree", and "Face Tree" on Cooper Creek at Nappa Merrie Station, are an enduring reminder of our pioneering past, and are approximately 300kms west of Thargomindah.
- Cameron Corner in the far south-west, is where the States of Queensland. South Australia and New South Wales merge, and is located approximately 400kms from Thargomindah.

Thargomindah is located in far south west Queensland, 1,000kms due west of Brisbane; 1,600kms from Adelaide, and 1,500kms north-west of Melbourne, with good sealed roads all the way.

can swim, paddle your canoe, go fishing, yabbying, or bird watching, or just take a leisurely stroll along the River Walk, which commences at the Caravan Park and takes you past the Cobb & Co Crossing and back through the main street of town.

Sealed roads lead to Noccundra, Eromanga, Quilpie and Toompine, and you can drive almost all the way to the South Australian Border on a sealed road, with short journeys on dirt roads to the Burke and Wills 'Dig Tree', and the famous town of Innamincka in South Australia.
