

Outback Queensland

Experience Channel Country Fishing ...

Discover the adventure...

...of fishing in the Channel Country, where three rivers and a creek wind their way through Queensland's Outback. Most rivers are "Carp Free" and you do not require a license to fish. Golden Perch (Yellow-belly) is the main fish species, freshwater catfish, spangled and silver perch are also available. Yabbies are plentiful during the winter months, May-August. Check weather and road conditions prior to travel.

Bulloo River - Thargomindah

Along the Bulloo River through Thargomindah there are many water holes and lagoons where you can cast a line for the elusive golden Perch (Yellow Belly) or toss in a yabby pot for a feed of Cherax destructor, our local yabby.

No license or permit is required to fish the Bulloo River, which is declared a carp free area. Note that Golden Perch (Yellow Belly) have a bag limit of 10 and a minimum size of 30cms.

Yabbies have a bag limit of 100 in Queensland and yabby females with eggs must be returned to the water and any yabby caught cannot be used as bait in any other location but the Bulloo River.

Wilson River - Noccundra


Excellent fishing and yabbying can be had at the Wilson River, 140km west of Thargomindah and at the Cooper Creek also in the Bulloo Shire area. Both these waterways are also "Carp Free" zones.

Golden Perch (Yellow Belly) are caught in both the Wilson and the Cooper and all the regulations applying to the Bulloo River apply regarding size and bag limits, the only difference being on the Cooper in South Australia where a bag limit for Yellow belly is 5 and a size limit of 33cm applies. With all fishing when using a boat a current boat licence is required.

Lake Bindegolly National Park

No fishing or camping is permitted on the park but bush camping is allowed on the stock route, south of the highway at the Lake Bindegolly Bridge.

Bulloo Shire Channel Country



Paroo River - Hungerford & Eulo

Fishing is permitted either side of the bridge crossing and mainly Golden Perch (Yellow Belly) and catfish. All carp caught must be disposed of and not used as bait nor transported out of area. A permit or licence is not required, however there is a bag limit of 10 Golden Perch per day and a minimum size of 30cms. Bait of the area must be used in the area only, No bait is to be bought into the area.









Cooper Creek - Burke & Wills Dig Tree & Innamincka

Golden Perch are a popular species caught and in Queensland a bag limit of 10 and a minimum size of 30cms applies. In South Australia a bag limit of 5 applies and a limit of 33cm applies.

Currawinya National Park



Fishing is permitted in the Corni Paroo and Caiwarro waterholes of the Caiwarro section of Currawinya National Park, and at Ourimperee waterhole. However any carp caught from the Paroo River must be disposed of and not used as bait or removed and used in any other location. Use only bait caught in the area. No permit is required however a bag limit of 10 Golden Perch per day exists and a minimum size of 30cms per fish. Fishing is available at Lake Numalla (fresh water), but only in restricted areas of the lake; see ranger staff for information regarding restricted areas or see information boards at lake Numalla. All Carp caught at the lake must be disposed of and not used as bait or removed and used in any other location.
